- Mike and Danny Nall w/ LG&E completed the street lights audit and the city will receive one monthly invoice combining all city light posts. After Mike receives the LG&E contract, the street lights will start to be replaced the brighter bulbs.

NEW BUSINESS

- Brian attended a sidewalk safety webinar and learned of possible state and federal funds available.
- Liz will work on the Spring Newsletter for it to be printed and distributed this month.
- An announcement of the Briarwood clerk/treasurer position will be posted in the Newsletter, on the Briarwood Facebook page, and on the Briarwood website.
- Danny Nall w/LG&E and Mike will meet and determine which street light posts belong to Briarwood and which ones belong to Harmony Place, and which street lights need the brighter bulbs.
- Damage was done to the women's restroom door recently, and the picnic tables were overturned in the pavilion. Motion sensor lights, or a security system might be a way to stop the vandalism.
- Liz requested more police patrol for illegal U-Turns at Westport Rd and Japonica.
